The Frisco Historic Park & Museum strives to promote and preserve the Town of Frisco's heritage for future generations by providing a unique and quality educational museum experience to our community and its visitors.



The Museum is operated by the Town of Frisco as an amenity to the community with no charge for admission. The Schoolhouse (located on its original site and listed on the National Register of Historic Places) opened its doors to the public as a museum in 1983. During the following 15 years, 11 other historic structures were added to the park complex, all of which were restored to display artifacts and exhibits depicting historic periods from the 1880's to the 1960's.

The Museum plays a fundamental educational role in our community, allowing patrons to experience local historical and cultural heritage. The museum's self-guided interpretive experience focuses on the 12 historic structures, displaying exhibits and artifacts from Frisco's past, and showcasing pioneer log architecture and building techniques. Exhibits include women's history, mining, trapping, Ute Indian, ranching and much more.

Students and visitors alike learn about:

- * Colorado Wildlife



Our Educational Programs:

- **Frisco History Curriculum**

"Frisco Fun Facts!"

Learn about the trapping and mining history and culture of Frisco during 1870-1930. Discover how two railroads ran through town and find out what it was like going to school 100 years ago.

- **Owl Curriculum**

"Hoo Hoo Knows Owls?"

Get an inside look into the life of Owls. Learn about "hoo" they are and what role they play in woodland life. Owl pellet dissection included.



- **Beaver Curriculum**

"Build a Beaver"

Step into a Beaver's shoes - literally - and feel what it is like to be "Nature's Engineer"



- **Ute Curriculum**

"The Ute Legacy"

Bring your dancing shoes as you experience the Ute "Bear Dance". Join us in a fun session of discussion about their proud heritage.

All programs provide hands-on components and are accompanied by a guided tour of the historic park buildings.
