Zero-Waste Details

- Our goal is to divert at least 50% of the waste away from the landfill through composting and recycling.
- Vendors can compete for the Green Flame Award, and winners will be eligible for free entry next year, an award, and recognition.
- HC3 will staff volunteers at ZW Tents for material collection which are available at locations throughout the event.
- HC3 staff/volunteers will educate you and visitors on how to properly dispose of items.
- HC3 volunteers (Green Shirts) are not haulers – they are educators and can help with separation.
- Every vendor is responsible for taking their compost, recycling, and trash to designated dumpsters.

2019 BBQ Recycling and Composting guidelines

NOTE: Guidelines are specific to Frisco and are likely different from your community AND any packaging supplier

- BPI Compostable Products and Styrofoam are **NOT** allowed.
 - If you are caught using these products, it will be documented for future considerations of entry into this event.
- **Recycling**
 - Must be CLEAN (no food contamination)
 - Single-stream for paper, cardboard, aluminum, and plastics #1-7
 - Separate glass - glass can be recycled at the beer booths and dumpster located at the waste station on 3rd Ave.
- **Composting**
 - Food scraps **ONLY**
 - **NO PLANT-BASED PAPER OR PLASTIC PRODUCTS**
 - No paper products (i.e. napkins, paper towels, etc.)
- **WHEN IN DOUBT, THROW IT OUT – DO NOT PUT TRASH IN RECYCLING OR COMPOST BINS**
