Boat at the Frisco Bay Marina. Pontoons, runabouts, fishing boats, SUPS, kayaks & canoes are available in 2hr increments. Reservations are recommended.



Hike^{*} to beautiful Lily Pad Lake. This moderate 2.6 mile round-trip hike goes through aspen and pine forests with views of the Dillon Reservoir. Check the Trail Map for more.



Historic Park & Museum* is free & open Tues-Sun 10am to 5pm. Walk through thirteen buildings from Frisco's history, on the corner of 2nd & Main Street.



Frisco Adventure Park offers a disc golf course, bike park, skate park, camping and tons of hiking trails. Don't forget to bring your own equipment.



Bike the 14 miles down hill from the top of Vail Pass. Many local bike shops offer shuttles. Or bike the 6 miles along the Dillon Reservoir between Frisco & Dillon Marinas.



Scenic Drive^{*} to Aspen over the paved, summer only Independence Pass or to Como over the dirt 4x4 Boreas Pass. More options available on the Scenic Byway Map.



Fish at Meadow Creek Park, along the North Ten Mile Creek, Officer's Gulch or on the Dillon Reservoir. Pole rentals available through Frisco Bay Marina and Trouts.



Mountain Bike at many of the ski resorts or take in the views on the 4.3 mile Lakeshore Perimeter Trail on the Peninsula Recreation Area.



Sunset at Sapphire Point* Hike the 0.8 mile loop around Sapphire Point on Swan Mountain Road. This is a flat, wide trail for the whole family.



Local Art Galleries* including free glass blowing demos at the Gatherhouse Glass Studio. Ask for the Main Street Mile Map for all the options.



Copper Mountain Alpine Coaster* Be sure to check out all of Copper Mountain's summer activities for the family at www.CopperColorado.com



Press a Penny* at the Visitor Information Center, 300 Main Street. Bring \$0.51, select one of four designs and press a penny the old fashion way.



Dine on a Patio for breakfast, lunch, happy hour and dinner at many of the 35+ local restaurants. Ask for the local restaurant guide.



Concerts in the Park are at 5:30pm on Thursday nights at the Frisco Historic Park Gazebo from late-June through August. Concerts are free. Drinks available for purchase, benefiting local non-profits.

Tube at the Frisco Adventure Park. Select your favorite lane and Slide down the 1,200ft long lanes. The kids must be 36 inches or taller. Reservations are recommended.



Snowshoe to Rainbow Lake. This easy 1.5 mile roundtrip hike goes through marsh and forested areas and ends at a small alpine lake. Check the Trail Map for more options.



Nordic Ski at the Frisco Nordic Center, which offers a beautiful 27 km of ski trails, 10 km of snowshoe trails. Rentals and lessons are available. Trail pass required.



Sled at the free Frisco sledding hill at the Frisco Nordic Center. Bring your own sleds and enjoy this old fashioned winter activity. The hill is not professionally maintained.



Fat Tire Bike the 8 miles from the Dickey Day Use Parking to the Breckenridge Recreation Center on the groomed and free recreation path.



Live Music^{*} at a variety of restaurants and venues in Frisco. Usually available Wednesday through Sunday. Ask us for the Frisco Happy Hour & Music Guide for details.



Frisco Escape Room* on Main Street. Try to beat the clock with your family and friends in the historically themed puzzle rooms.



FriscoClock* at the historic Frisco Clock in front of the Visitor Information Center. The clock is from circa 1910. Be sure to tag @townoffrisco on Instagram.



Historic Lectures^{*} at the Frisco Historic Park & Museum are on Wednesdays at 3pm February through March and at 12pm June through August. Free admission.
